APA CHECKLIST

TITLE PAGE

Title page formatting guidelines

- Choice of 6 fonts (Calibri, 11 point; Arial 11 point; Lucida Sans Unicode, 10 point; Times New Roman, 12 point; Georgia, 11 point; Computer Modern, 10 point). Choose one font and use it throughout the paper.
- One-inch margins throughout the entire paper
- Page number (1) is in header and aligned right
- The following pieces of information are centered in the top half of the page:
 - Title of Paper, bolded
 - Student Name
 - o Rasmussen College
 - o Course Number: Course Title
 - Instructor's Name
 - Assignment Due Date

BODY OF PAPER

Body of paper - general formatting guidelines

- Page number (2,3,4, etc.) in header, aligned right
- Double spaced
- Title centered and bolded at top of page
- <u>Summaries and paraphrases</u> are written in student author's voice/words and include in-text citations
- Three of more consecutive words from source material are treated as <u>quotations</u>
- Quotes are enclosed in quotation marks and in-text citations include page or paragraph numbers
- All in-text citations have a matching reference item in the References page
- Student voice is evident; supported but not replaced by source material
- Introduction
 - Introduces the topic covered in the paper
 - States the thesis or position to be supported in the body of the paper
 - Usually one or two paragraphs in length
- Body
 - Main part of paper
 - o Points presented in logical order to support thesis, one point per paragraph
 - Length of this section varies; usually a minimum of three paragraphs
- Conclusion
 - Restates the thesis
 - Reinforces major points made in the body of the paper
 - Usually one or two paragraphs in length

REFERENCES LIST

References list formatting guidelines

The references list is the last section of the paper and begins on its own page

- The word References is centered and **bolded** at the top of the page
- Entries are double spaced and are listed in alphabetical order by the first word of entry
- Hanging indent is used for references that continue beyond one line
- All <u>sources listed in the References section are cited using matching in-text citations</u> within the text of the paper

TYPES OF SOURCES

- <u>Multiple types of sources referenced</u>, including books, academic journal articles, and reputable websites
- <u>Sources are credible</u>, accurate, relevant, and up-to-date (written by an authority, balanced, and current)
- Sources contain more than one point of view, or if biased, are balanced by another
